The Escondido Figure Skating Club invites you to the 12th Annual Hidden Valley Open Championships to be held at Escondido Iceoplex, located at 555 North Tulip St., Escondido, California. The Competition arena ice surface measures 100' X 200' with slightly rounded corners.

The Hidden Valley Open will consist of three sections: U.S. FIGURE SKATING qualifying type events, Showcase events and New Wave Free Skating events.

Events are open to all eligible persons registered with U.S. Figure Skating and to skaters from all other ISU Member Federations. The 2012 Hidden Valley Open Championships will be conducted in accordance with the 2012 U.S. Figure Skating Rules and Standards except as noted in this Announcement. Official notices and bulletins will be posted on the official bulletin board at the Iceoplex Escondido arena and on the Escondido Figure Skating Club website (Escondidofsc.org).

The Hidden Valley Open New Wave events will be open to all eligible persons registered with U.S. Figure Skating or registered with the U.S. Figure Skating Basic Skills and will include events compatible with ISI WeSkate Program. Girls and Boys may be combined to allow an event to take place.

ENTRY DEADLINE IS Wednesday, June 9, 2012

All entries MUST BE **RECEIVED** (not postmarked) by the Registrar NO LATER than midnight, June 9, 2012. Entries received after this date may be accepted at the discretion of the Escondido Figure Skating Club Competition Committee and ONLY if accompanied by a **\$30.00 late fee, but no entries will be accepted later than midnight, June 15, 2012.** All entries must be completely filled out and signed by the competitor (parent, if the competitor is under the age of 18). Incomplete entries will be returned and must be completed and returned by the closing date for entries.

Each Coach of record will receive one Coach's Credential. The Coach must be a U.S. Figure Skating Member and a PSA registered Member.

NEW WAVE EVENTS

New Wave Events Tots through Pre-Juvenile will be divided into groups of no more than 12 competitors. Groups will be segregated by Birthdates. There will be no Final Rounds

U.S. FIGURE SKATING EVENTS

Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary, Pre-Juvenile, Juvenile and Open Juvenile entrants Skate a Free Skating Program.

Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior entrants may skate a Short Program and a Freeskating Program. The Short Program will not be combined with the Free Skate Program. They will be separate events.

EVENT QUALIFICATION

Test levels as of June 8, 2012 will control eligibility for all events. Note: Competitors may enter an event at one higher level than their Free Skating Test.

At the discretion of the Chief Referee, events may be combined to allow skaters the chance to compete. If this is not possible, single entries will be offered the opportunity to skate an exhibition or choose a refund for the event not skated.

AWARDS

Medals will be awarded 1 through 4 in all events.

REFUND OF ENTRY FEE(S)

Entry fees are refundable only if the competition is not held, or if withdrawal of an entry is made before June 8, 2012. Three entries in any event constitute a competition.

REGISTRATION

A registration desk will be in the lobby of the Iceoplex rink on the dates of the competition and will be manned commencing one hour prior to the start of each day's events. All competitors should check in at the registration desk at least 40 minutes prior to their scheduled event. The official bulletin board will list any schedule changes or other information needed by competitors. Events will not be delayed for competitors who arrive late. The competitors should also be ready to check in with the Ice Monitor 15 minutes prior to their event start time.

MUSIC

The Escondido Figure Skating Club music system will accommodate CD, CD-RW-CD (CD preferred). For best results, we recommend that program music be recorded on Music Quality CD disks. Additionally, CDs should be formatted so that music will begin to play immediately (no practice CDs for the competition, please). Bring a backup copy of your music.

VIDEOTAPING AND/OR PHOTOGRAPHY

Contractual commitments with our Videographer and Professional Photographer require that we limit all private video taping and still photographs to your own skater.

Any spectator seen shooting either video or stills of a skater other than her/his own shall be removed from the arena. No flash photography is permitted in the arena at any time.

PRACTICE ICE

There will be Practice Ice commencing one day prior to the competition's actual start. The amount of available practice ice will be set in accordance with requests for practice ice received prior to the Practice Ice deadline of July 2, 2012. Pre-Competition Practice Ice Music play order will be determined by a random draw prior to the posting of practice assignments. When sessions are filled, any subsequent vacancies will be filled in order of practice request received.

Additional Open Practice Ice (Unofficial Ice) will be scheduled each day of the competition beginning on the first day of the competition. A practice ice schedule for each day of the competition will be available as soon as the tentative competition schedule is established. The Open Practice Ice times will be posted on the official bulletin board and also on the Club's website. No music will be played during Open Practice Ice Sessions

All Practice Ice Sessions are 30 minutes and will be limited to 22 competitors per session. Each session will cost \$20.

SHOWCASE EVENTS

RULES AND INFORMATION

1. ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE:

All entry qualifications must be attained as of June 9, 2012. Those eligible under U.S. Figure Skating Rules, reinstated skaters and representatives of other governing bodies may compete.

2. SHOWCASE EVENTS--BASIS OF JUDGING:

- a. Performances will be judged for theatrical and artistic qualities, from an entertainment standpoint.
- b. Technical skating skill and difficulty will not be rewarded as such; however, skating must be the major element of the performance and of sufficient quality to support the theatrical elements chosen.
- c. *Unintended falls, poorly executed skating elements and obvious losses of control will reduce contestant's marks.*
- d. Jump difficulty is not rewarded in showcase, therefore jumps, if choreographed, should be those performed with style, flow and confidence. Jumps should not be used but as the choreography requires.
- e. Theatrical elements evaluated will include: Energy, poise, acting, pantomime, eye contact, choreography, form, extension and the use of costumes, ice and props.
- f. One performance mark incorporating the 6.0 scoring system will be assigned each performance by each judge. No technical skating mark will be used. Any overtime penalties will be posted with the results.

3. EVENTS: Singles skaters, once qualified for a level, may enter any or all events for which they meet age and test requirements. Singles need not qualify separately for multiple events. Duets need not qualify but must meet test requirements stated in #6.

a. Singles Events will be:

- i. Dramatic Entertainment: A serious, emotional, artistic interpretation.
- ii. Light Entertainment: Any performance not serious enough to be considered dramatic.
- iii. Skaters may enter any or all of these single events at the level for which they are qualified.

b. Duet: A theatrical/artistic performance by any two contestants.

The highest test level of a duet member will determine the duet competition level.

c. Singles contestants may enter events only at their ages and test levels as of June 9, 2012.

5. SPECIFICS:

- a. There is no minimum time requirement for any event.
- b. Showcase events will not be segregated by gender.
- c. Where the number of entrants requires the separation into groups, awards will be given to each group. There will be no final rounds for any Showcase event.
- d. There will be a 0.2 deduction for each 5 seconds in excess of the maximum performance and prop placement time.
- e. Timing starts with the first motion of the body and ends when motion stops.
- f. Props and scenery must be placed and removed by single and duet contestants within one minute. No assistance is allowed; violations will be penalized .2 for each 5 seconds excess time or assistance. Posted results will indicate any such deductions.
- g. Singles competitors who place 1st through 4th in a singles artistic event may qualify for National Showcase. Eligible skaters will have placed 1st through 4th as previously described and will have passed the Preliminary Free Skating test and above OR completed requirements for Adult Interpretive Free Skating and above. Duets and Ensembles need not qualify by placement for National Showcase.
